1 MR. BRADFORD: I see no other way.

2 SUPERVISOR WARD: Did you examine Balliscan
3 photographs of bullets 47, the Senator Kennedy bullet, and
4 54, the Weisel bullet, which were represented to you to have
5 been photographed on December 16th of 1970?

6 MR. BRADFORD: Yes.

7 SUPERVISOR WARD: Now, there is a difference
8 between the bullets that were photographed, this -- there
9 is a difference between the photographs of this May and the
10 earlier December date.

11 Did you compare the photographs with
12 pictures of the same bullets taken April 26th of this year?

13 MR. BRADFORD: Yes.

14 SUPERVISOR WARD: So, we have the two dates,
15 December 16th, 1970, those pictures, and the pictures taken
16 April 26th of this year at my request.

17 Did you arrive at any conclusions
18 regarding any changes that might have occurred in the
19 quality of any specific markings on these bullets?

20 MR. BRADFORD: Yes.

21 SUPERVISOR WARD: And what were those?

22 MR. BRADFORD: I could find no significant
23 changes in the types of marks which would be usable as
24 identification between the two sets of photographs.

25 SUPERVISOR WARD: I raised that question,
26 Mr. Bradford, for the reason that it has been suggested
27 in some quarters that age could have a serious effect on
28 the quality of the bullets and their integrity for
