MRS. SIRHAN stated that shortly after her son, SIRHAN, had received the money from the insurance settlement regarding his accident he had in 1956, he gave her \$1,000 in \$100 dollar bills. She said she did not know what he did with the balance of the money he received but was of the opinion that he gave some of it to ADEL and bought things for the house. MRS. SIRHAN was not sure of the date that she received the \$1,000 and could not remember when ADEL began to draw money from the \$1,000 amount. SIRHAN kept asking her for money until finally the amount was down to four \$100 dollar bills. At this time SIRHAN came to her and to the best of her recollection she thought it was approximately three or four days before the KENNEDY shooting, and asked her for \$300, stating that the \$300 was going to be used to obtain some kind of job for himself. MRS. SIRHAN refused to give him the money and accused him of spending the other money on horse races.

* MRS. SIRHAN thought it was just prior to the shooting, a day or two, that SIRHAN again asked her for \$300 and again alleging that he was going to use the money to obtain some kind of job. He never told her what the job was going to be. MRS. SIRHAN took the remaining four \$100 dollar bills and threw them at SIRHAN shouting, "Take it all and blow it on the horses". SIRHAN picked up the money, pocketed \$300, returned \$100 to his mother and said, "This is for you mother". MRS. SIRHAN stated that she is now in the process of spending the remaining \$100 for household expenses.

* Present during this interview was MUNIR SIRHAN and ADEL SIRHAN.

* On one occasion ADEL interjected his mother stating, "I think SIRHAN wanted the \$300 to buy a horse with". This was the only statement made by either brother regarding money SIRHAN received from the settlement.

I asked Mary Sirhan about the \$400 on Sirhan @ time of arrest & she told me that she had been holding ins. money for Sirhan - when it got down to \$500 not 400 he asked for it all (on Mon. 6-3-68) & she argued with Sirhan where upon Sirhan told her to keep \$100 & give him \$400 (not 300). She gave him 400 - kept 100 for household expenses on 6-3-68. Monday gave the \$400 to Sirhan Monday. Rose Ingham Mangon

OPINION ON COMPROMISE AND RELEASE


An exercise boy, 22, earnings \$375.00 a month, sustained compensable injury to his head, face, left eye and back on September 25, 1966. Temporary disability is in dispute, but applicant returned to work for a time.

Compromise and Release has been filed offering \$2,000.00, less \$50.00 payable to Dr. Maurice W. Nugent, and less \$45.00 payable to Dr. Leonard J. Yamshon in full satisfaction of their liens.

All medical treatment to date of settlement has been paid by the carrier; if there is any more applicant is to pay it.

In evaluating this settlement I have had the benefit of advice from the Medical Bureau and two Permanent Disability Rating Specialists. I believe that the Compromise and Release is adequate and should be approved in accordance with its terms.

Applicant's attorneys request a fee of \$200.00, which is reasonable.
