Dr. William Neal removed a slug from victim William Weisel. Nurse Helen Lyum received the bullet from Dr. Neal and gave it to Nurse Gail Adams. Adams gave it to Deryce Pine. Pine placed it in a locked cabinet. Nurse Donna J. Brown removed the slug from the cabinet and gave it to Officer L. Orozco.

56 1 Slug, .22 caliber long, (marked "LMO" on base) from victim Weisel.

Dr. Casper Fuchs removed the bullet fragments from victim Schrade. Dr. Fuchs gave the fragments to Nurse Stella Harrigan. Harrigan gave the fragments to Gail Adams. Adams gave them to Deryce Pine who placed them in a locked cabinet. Nurse Donna Brown also

removed these fragments from the cabinet and gave them to Officer Orozco. ⁽⁷⁾

57 2 Bullet fragments from victim Schrade.

Deputy District Attorney Fitts indicated that Items 56 and 57 will be used in the trial. *note: this differs from Orozco's LAPD Property Report*
